I've fished here almost exclusively since 2003.

My passion in fishing is the pursuit of monster specks, and here in south Texas we have plenty of them. I am a conservative-minded sportsman when it comes to fishing, never pursuing limits or killing fish for the sake of my own or my customers' egos. If we keep trout to eat, we keep smaller specimens and, at most, half the state's allowed ten per person.

What I love in fishing is the thrill I get when I'm able to trick a fish into striking something made entirely by the hand of man, especially if the fish is a trout of magnum proportions. Consequently, I do everything I can to maximize my knowledge and skill level as it relates to all the equipment and strategies that help me achive my angling goals.

I have strong beliefs about many things related specifically to the pursuit of trophy speckled trout and about saltwater fishing in a more general sense. In these blogs, I'll share many of those beliefs, opinions and pass along observations I make about things I learn along the way.

I will at times try new products like rods, reels, lures, lines and other equipment, and will use these blogs to review them, always with the goal of remaining true to myself when doing so, placing honest evaluation above the desire to promote products for my own personal gain.
