Fishing continues excellent for numbers of fish, percentage of keepers, and we're catching a few big trout too. Most days, we are experiencing a decent topwater bite, as long as winds are reasonably light and onshore. Slow-sinking twitch baits are working well most every day too. Soft plastics tend to catch the most fish on days with north winds, or when the bite slows after a flurry. On a couple of recent occasions, I've found dangling a soft plastic under a cork to work far better than anything else. Work these deliberately, making plenty of splash with the cork and allowing it to sit for at least a couple seconds between twitches. Both Baffin and the ULM are holding fish in various areas. Biggest trout are all biting in water less than crotch-deep, more like knee-deep. Sandy, grassy bottoms holding more fish than rocks, from what I can see.
