

Fishing has been generally difficult during the peak of the trophy trout season, but lately, the worm has turned somewhat for me. Over the last 6 trips, we've managed 8 trout over 25 inches, with 3 over 27 and 3 over 7 pounds. Biggest was a 7 3/4 pounder I caught today (3/25) on a Super Spook Junior. Best bite for trout lately has been very early in the morning in low light conditions on small topwaters. Redfish are biting somewhat better after the sun gets fully up, and we've caught quite a few big carp lately, mostly on soft plastics, a few on bright, sinking Corkies. Biggest was about 32 inches and 12 1/2 pounds. Lots of bait showing up around some of the spoils, but the bite has been mysteriously slow in those areas despite all the good signs indicating fish are there. March is usually kind of a kick-off month for fishing around them, so I keep waiting for the fishing on the fringes and crowns of the sand bars to heat up.
